DAY 1 - THE ONE BEFORE THE MILLION

TRULY I TELL YOU, WHATEVER YOU DID FOR ONE OF THE LEAST OF THESE BROTHERS AND SISTERS OF MINE, YOU DID FOR ME. - MATTHEW 25:40 (NIV)

This powerful verse comes in the middle of Jesus' teaching on the Final Judgment. He describes the day when all nations will stand before Him, separated like sheep and goats. The standard? Not titles, achievements, or status - but acts of love.

"I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you welcomed me. I was naked, and you clothed me. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me." (Matthew 25:35–36)

The righteous, bewildered, will ask, "When did we ever see You, Lord?" And Jesus' reply is stunning: "Whatever you did for the least of these, you did for Me."

Think of it this way: Parents often say that when you bless their child, you bless them. If you care for their son or daughter, it feels as if you have cared for the parent directly. In the same way, God identifies personally with His children in need. When we serve them, we serve Him.

Scripture is clear - widows, orphans, the vulnerable, and the forgotten are close to His heart (James 1:27, Deuteronomy 10:18, Isaiah 1:17). Today, that may look like the homeless, the lonely, the imprisoned, or even someone sitting quietly in your own circle who feels unseen.

EACH PERSON MATTERS. EACH SOUL IS PRECIOUS.

As followers of Jesus, we long for revival, for thousands - even millions - to encounter Christ. But revival always starts small. A million salvations are simply a million individual "yeses" to Jesus. On the last day, you will not stand before God with the crowd. You will stand before Him alone. And in that moment, the "one" will matter - the one life you lived, and the ones you touched along the way.

So, as we pray for revival and dream of reaching the multitudes, let's not miss the person in front of us. The hungry neighbour. The forgotten relative. The stranger in need of kindness. Before the millions comes the one.

Father God,

It is a privilege to be called a child of God. Knowing that, one day, I will stand before you in order to give an account for my days on earth fills me with hope and joy but also a great sense of responsibility.

Father, please prompt me by the power and presence of your Holy Spirit to see the 'ones' in my life and sphere who need help. The ones who need You. May I be like the Good Samaritan who did not pass by on the other side of the road but stopped and inquired of the need of my fellow neighbour.

Before I cry out for millions to be saved and for revival to sweep our nations, remind me of the 'one' right in front of me. The 'one' that you love.

DAY 2 - HOPE BEHIND BARS

THE SPIRIT OF THE SOVEREIGN LORD IS ON ME, BECAUSE THE LORD HAS ANOINTED ME TO PROCLAIM GOOD NEWS TO THE POOR. HE HAS SENT ME TO BIND UP THE BROKEN HEARTED, TO PROCLAIM FREEDOM FOR THE CAPTIVES... - ISAIAH 61:1 (NIV)

Prison walls are thick, but they cannot keep out the love of God.

I can only imagine the loneliness, regret, and pain that imprisonment brings. To wake each day to the weight of past decisions must be humbling beyond words. Many would say, "They're only getting what they deserve." But the truth is - every life carries a story, and every story is one God longs to redeem.

We may not be able to fully grasp the journey of every inmate, but this we know with certainty: the Gospel has the power to change any heart. I've seen footage of worship in prisons - men and women in jumpsuits, hands raised, voices lifted in praise. For a moment, the chains don't matter. For a moment, they taste freedom.

But when the music fades, the bars remain. That's why the freedom Christ gives is so precious - it cannot be locked away. No one can take your worship, your prayer, or your relationship with Jesus. That freedom is eternal.

This is why we at CBN UK are passionate about placing Bibles in prisons. A Bible is never just a book - it is the living Word of God. It whispers to the forgotten, "You are loved." It lifts the broken hearted, reminding them, "You are not alone." It brings healing, identity, and hope of salvation.

Every time we place Scripture into the hands of a prisoner, we give more than pages - we offer the chance of transformation, freedom, and eternity with Christ.



Father God.

Thank you that your love penetrates even the hardest of hearts and heals even the most broken of stories. Where would we be without you, Lord? We worship you and give you praise for saving time after time, giving second and third and fourth chances to us when we fall short.

Lord, I ask that you personally would lay on my heart how I can practically or prayerfully support the people in my nation who are currently incarcerated. May I never have a heart that carelessly goes about my days and ways, forgetting that there are people in the world who need help.

Who need You, Lord. Remind me of ways that I can be your hands and feet to the lost, the lonely and the least.

DAY 3 - MAKING JESUS GO VIRAL

YOUR WORD IS A LAMP TO MY FEET AND A LIGHT TO MY PATH. - PSALM 119:105 (NIV)

I recently came across a short video set in the 1980s where teenagers imagined life in the future. They pictured people spending most of their time in front of screens, glued to devices instead of enjoying face-to-face conversations.

It was meant to be futuristic. Instead, it feels all too real.

Our world today is saturated with technology. Social media scrolls fill the hours. People turn to search engines and AI for guidance, sometimes more quickly than they turn to family, friends - or even God.

We can't simply wish things were different. This is the world we live in. But here's the good news: what the enemy might use for distraction, God can use for transformation.

At CBN UK, we are committed to stepping into the digital space with purpose. If people are spending their lives online, then we want to meet them there - with hope, with truth, with Jesus. Not by copying the world's habits, but by offering something different, something eternal.

DAY 4 - THE NEXT GENERATION

SUPPOSE ONE OF YOU HAS A HUNDRED SHEEP AND LOSES ONE OF THEM. DOESN'T HE LEAVE THE NINETY-NINE IN THE OPEN COUNTRY AND GO AFTER THE LOST SHEEP UNTIL HE FINDS IT?

- LUKE 15:4 (NIV)

God's Word makes it crystal clear: faith isn't meant to end with us. It's a legacy we are called to pass on to the next generation. The Bible repeatedly reminds us of this responsibility:

PROVERBS 22:6 PSALM 78:4 DEUTERONOMY 6:7

Take time to look up these verses for yourself - you'll see the heart of God for children and the call to teach them His ways.

Jesus never treated children as an afterthought. He gave them His time, His blessing, and even used them as an example for what true greatness in the Kingdom looks like:

"He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: 'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 18:2-4 (NIV)

There is something remarkable about a child's trust. Their innocence and openness often fade as we grow older and become skeptical. But Jesus challenges us to return to that childlike posture of humility, dependence, and faith.

Throughout Scripture, whenever God moved powerfully, His people were instructed to tell the story - to pass it on to their children and their children's children. Why? Because stories of God's faithfulness fuel the faith of future generations. If we stop telling the stories, we risk raising a generation that forgets what God has done.



Children are not just "the church of tomorrow." If they are alive today, they are the church today! They belong in prayer, in worship, in teaching, and in fellowship. Yes, our methods may need adjusting for different ages, but our mission is the same: to disciple them.

When we raise children on the Word of God, we equip them to stand strong in a world full of distractions and deception. We empower them to make choices that honour Christ and to carry the Gospel further than we ever could. So today, let's commit ourselves to this vital calling:

PRAY

For the young people in your church, your community, and across the nation - that they would be deeply discipled in Jesus.

Father God,

Thank you for the lives of the younger generation in our Churches. They bring so much vibrancy and energy to our lives and to our Church life. Father, please help me to know how I can personally take ownership for the younger generation in my Church and my life.

Remind me daily that they are the Church of today and that it is my responsibility to train them up in the ways that they should go so that when they are older, they will not depart from it.

In Jesus' name, amen.

SHARE

Your story. Be intentional in how you live before them, knowing they are watching how you walk with God.

GIVE

Whether your time, your resources, or your encouragement - into ministries and movements that are reaching the next generation.

When we invest in children and youth, we're not just shaping their future - we're strengthening the church today and building a legacy that will outlast us.

DAY 5 - YOUR GIFT BRINGS LIFE

ON EACH SIDE OF THE RIVER STOOD THE TREE OF LIFE, BEARING TWELVE CROPS OF FRUIT, YIELDING ITS FRUIT EVERY MONTH. AND THE LEAVES OF THE TREE ARE FOR THE HEALING OF THE NATIONS.

- REVELATION 22:2 (NIV)

As we close this devotional journey, here's a beautiful reminder: your gift is more than an action - it's a seed of life.

In Revelation, John describes the tree of life, constantly bearing fruit and offering leaves for the healing of the nations. What a picture of God's Kingdom at work! Just as that tree brings renewal and restoration, our obedience and generosity - whether in prayer, service, encouragement, or giving - can bring healing and hope to those in need.

The need in our world is vast. It can feel overwhelming at times. But Scripture shows us that God's design is for many branches, each bearing fruit in its own season. That means we're not called to do everything - we're called to do our part.

Each of these areas requires people who will say, "Here I am, Lord - use me." For some, that will mean stepping out to serve directly. For others, it may mean giving generously so the work of others can flourish.

Paul reminds us in Romans 12:6 - 8 that generosity itself is a spiritual gift. When you give, you're not just supporting a mission - you're bearing fruit for God's Kingdom. And like the tree of life, your offering has the power to bring healing and hope that reaches far beyond what you can see.

Your gift is personal. But when placed in God's hands, it becomes powerful - bringing fruit that lasts and life that heals.
